ALONG THE UNPAVED ROAD FROM VINEYARD TO WINERY IN ALMANSA, SPAIN, THE FALLEN DARK GARNACHA TINTORERA GRAPES HAVE DYED THE ROAD BLACK. SENDA NEGRA MEANS "DARK ROAD" AND THIS DEEP WINE PAYS HOMAGE TO THIS PLACE.



ALMANSA IS A SPANISH DENOMINATION OF ORIGIN (DO) and the easternmost wine region in Castilla-La Mancha, Spain.

The designation draws its name from the largest town in the area, known for its hovering 14th-Century castle, the Castillo de Almansa. It was the frontier territory between the Moorish and Christian kingdoms of Aragon and Castilla. The climate is continental with long, hot summers and cold winters, with sparse rainfall. The stony and limy soils retain water and the altitude (900m above sea level) mitigates the hot summer sunshine. This area favors red grapes and has been farmed viticulturally since the 16th century.

Our **SENDA NEGRA** is made from 100% Old Vines Garnacha Tintorera with more than 50-year-old vines, grown ecologically at 900m above sea level. Dark red color. Powerful, spirituous aromas with ripe fruit, sweet spices, red berries, toasted balsamic with smoky marked ends of toasted vanilla. Powerful, tasty, complex, concentrated on the palate.
