

TEJO WINE REGION

The Tejo region is located in the heart of Portugal, a short drive from Lisbon. Viticulture has deep roots in Tejo and it is heralded as one of the oldest wine producing regions in the country. Vineyards have graced the banks of the Tejo River (Tagus in English) since Roman times, and the influence of past grape-growing cultures is evident in the many architectural relics dotting the landscape.

LISBOA WINE REGION

Toward the north of the city of Lisbon lies the Lisboa region, with rolling hills that stretch along the Atlantic coast. It is considered to be the heart and soul of the Portuguese winemaking industry. Thanks to these winds, the region is dotted with picturesque windmills.

The “Faisão” (pheasant) is native to Asia, but was brought to Portugal by merchants in the middle ages. It is an exquisite bird with brightly colored feathers and unique beauty that gives inspiration to our wines.

VINHO TINTO RED BLEND

LOCATED IN THE HEART OF PORTUGAL: DOC Do Tejo occupies almost the same large area as VR Tejo, on either side of the River Tagus (Tejo in Portuguese) as it flows gently along in a south-westerly direction towards its estuary at Lisbon. Until recently the DOC was called Ribatejo and the “vinho regional Ribatejano.”

APPELLATIONS: Tejo and Lisbon

VARIETALS: Field blend with main varieties: Castelão and Aragonês


VINIFICATION: Total destemming and prolonged skin maceration. Alcoholic fermentation at 82°F.

TECH NOTES: ABV: 13.0 | TA: 5.1 g/L | pH: 3.68

COLOR: Intense ruby with red hues.

AROMA: Intense red berries.

FLAVOR: Smooth and full of flavor.



FOOD PAIRING: Ideal to accompany soft cheeses and grilled meat. Consume at 64°F.
