



Marlborough's worst ever fire on Boxing Day 2000, burnt 6,000 hectares (almost 15,000 acres) over the course of three days, killed thousands of livestock and threatened the wine town of Blenheim, as well as a number of vineyards and wineries. Disaster was avoided by the brave residents, of what is now known as Fireroad, who battled the blaze by using buckets and hand held hoses and were eventually assisted by a fortunate wind shift. The Fireroad vineyards flourish in the same hot and dry climate that was the catalyst for such a mighty blaze.

A lifted nose showing aromas of passion fruit, white peach and kiwi fruit with refreshing herbal and mineral notes. Light-bodied and refreshing with typical Marlborough flavours of passion fruit, gooseberry and grapefruit. A pleasing herbaceous thread leads to a long lingering finish.

Fire Road Pinot Noir 2018

"This is a featherlight, strawberry-hued Pinot with heaps of ripe, juicy red berry and plum fruit backed by a little vanilla and cinnamon spice. Satiny in texture, the tangy fruit tiptoes on the tongue, supported by gentle, sinewy tannins and with a slightly bitter finish. A easy-drinking red to pop in the fridge."

Pale green color. Bursting with bright aromas of gooseberry, citrus and crushed herbs. An elegant palate with fine layers of grapefruit combined with herbaceous characters and a slight salty note on the finish. This wine is 'lighter' in alcohol, with no compromise on tropical flavor intensity or complexity.
