RESSÒ in Catalan means "Echo" **Wines that resonates the terroir of the Mediterranean coast**

Perched high above the Catalan coast on the Mediterranean sea, the Ressò vineyards flourish as the climate is extreme Mediterranean with very low rainfall but with the peculiarity of a near constant presence of either the "Cers wind" (from the interior land to the sea) or the "Garbí wind" (offshore breeze). Ressò in Catalan means "echo" or "notoriety" and is a reflection of these winds.

THE VINEYARDS

The vineyards are located in the Terra Alta region in the far southwest of the Catalunya DO, west of the province of Tarragona. The Mediterranean climate with the constant winds combined with very cold winters and very hot summers produce very special fruit. The old-vine vineyards are planted using the goblet system with a short pruning system and an average plant density of 2,500 vines per hectare. The younger vineyards are trellised using spur pruning and are planted at a density of 3,000 vines per hectare.

THE WINES



White: We try to capture the full fruitiness of white Garnacha: notes of white fruits and stone fruits combine with a background of citrus and dried mountain herbs.



Red: Intense aromas of red Garnacha grape. Intense fruitiness, freshness and a touch of herbs, all complemented by the spicy notes of the Syrah grape followed by candied strawberries and black raspberry fruit flavors are augmented by licorice, mineral and peppery notes.
