### Family-Owned Since 1664

The Karp-Schreiber Estate has been family-owned since 1664. Today, Jobst-Julius Karp, the 13th generation of the family, manages this traditional wine estate. Having gained a degree in oenology and viticulture engineering and touring the world of wine, he brings an international understanding to his family's historic estate.

### Slate Slopes of The Mosel

Their riesling is cultivated on 15 acres of slate terroir, mostly steep sloping, and includes the Grand Cru Juffer-Sonnenuhr, the best part of the Juffer slope beneath the rock-face sundial (Sonnenuhr). Manual labor is the only alternative on that hillside, with selective hand-harvesting.

### An Ode to Carp Fishing

The new label with a slate-colored background depicts a carp fish (German for Karp) and a quill (German for Schreiber). Carp fishing on the Mosel dates back at least to the winery's founding days. Viticulture and carp fishing have always been hand-in-hand here.

The Karps maintain a very high benchmark quality, and the wines are very expressive, mineral-driven, concentrated, with a crisp structure and fine fruit.
